## Letter from the Neighborhood Officer

Hello,

With the summer fast approaching, I wanted to remind you of a couple of ordinances that will help keep the neighborhood safe and peaceful this summer. The first is the curfew ordinance. In the City of Muskegon, "It is unlawful for any minor 16 years of age or younger" to be out between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. There are a few exceptions to this ordinance such as when they are accompanied by a parent or other guardian designated by that child's parent, to and from employment, emergencies, and to or from school related activities. Next is the city's noise ordinance, which states: "It shall be unlawful for any person to make, continue or cause to be made or continued any loud or unusual noise or any noise which either disturbs, injures, or endangers the comfort, repose, health, peace or safety of others, within the limits of the city."

Another ordinance that parents need to be aware of is the city's parental responsibility ordinance. It states: "It shall be unlawful for the parent of any minor to fail to exercise reasonable parental control and supervision of any minor, which failure results in the minor committing any criminal act, or to allow or encourage any minor to commit any criminal act or become delinquent in accordance with the probate code as it pertains to juveniles." Finally, I want to remind everyone that pit bulls are considered dangerous dogs in the City of Muskegon. There are numerous ordinances regarding dangerous dogs, so I cannot list them all here. However, you can find these ordinances under the city clerk link at the city's website, [www.shorelinecity.com](http://www.shorelinecity.com). It will be under Chapter 6 - Animals. A copy of the ordinances can be obtained at city hall. All of the ordinances that I mentioned will be strictly enforced this summer.
