Notice is hereby given that a Public Hearing will be held by the City Commission of the City of Muskegon to receive public comment on the proposed recreational improvements for Campbell Field and consideration on the adoption of a resolution approving a Michigan Department of Natural Resources Trust Fund (MNRTF) grant application for Campbell Field Recreational Improvements, at 5:30 p.m., August 11, 2020, electronically on the City of Muskegon Government Facebook Page. The meeting is being held remotely and electronically following Executive Order 2020-154 titled "Alternative Means to Conduct Government Business During the COVID-19 Pandemic."

The purpose of this public hearing is to gather comments and discuss the proposed recreational improvements to Campbell Field and obtain a resolution from the City of Muskegon authorizing the allocation of funds for Campbell Field Recreational Improvements. Matching funds for this project are derived from the Public Improvement Fund, specifically the PILOT extension that was approved for the Royale Glen Townhouses at the 11/26/2019 Commission Meeting. The City of Muskegon is also seeking \$200,000 in MNRTF grant money. Proposed recreational improvements to Campbell Field include- ball-field modifications, the addition of a dog park and paved walking trail, and replacing existing playground equipment.
